Cost

The registration fee for *Putting Ergonomics into Practice* is \$1,495 per person. This includes a comprehensive Course notebook, electronic copies of ergonomics assessment tools and reference materials, a copy of *The Occupational Ergonomics Handbook*, 2nd edition (a 2,000 page reference manual and \$240 value), and break refreshments.
